- Develop strategies for addressing unmet physical, emotional, and social needs of a person living with dementia.
- Practice practical, person-centered approaches to addressing specific aspects of dementia care and ensuring the safety of the person(s) in your care.
  - How to recognize and address pain
  - How to provide food and fluids
  - Strategies to prevent wandering and elopement
- Examine the concept and importance of person-centered care, specifically as it relates to caring for persons living with dementia.
